GENEALOGY INTEREST GROUP

At the last meeting of the Genealogy Interest Group John Shortland read an excerpt from the journal of his great grandfather Dr Edward Shortland (1812-1893) dated October 1887. He described in the style of the time his journey from Auckland to Sydney aboard the steamer 'Taraivera' to settle a land transaction and meet up with his third eldest son (John's grandfather) Thomas Willoughby Shortland and his wife Frances.

The detail of the journal included many personal aspects of life in Sydney during 1887 and a story of how Thomas met Frances at Bowermans Orchard in Parramatta while purchasing fruit.

Thomas, an ex British Naval Officer, was awarded a Silver Medal by the Royal Humane Society for a sea rescue and had emigrated to Australia to take up the position of a proof reader for the Sydney Morning Herald. He and Francis resided at O'Connell Street, Newtown where John's father, William John, was born just three months before the arrival of Dr Edward.

It is fortunate that papers like these are preserved for family members to read many years after the event. Such treasures should inspire more of our members to join the Genealogy Group and explore their own family histories. See back page for details.

HOW DO I CHANGE THE IMAGE ON MY DESKTOP WALLPAPER?

A BETTER IMAGE SEARCH

We should all know of the joy that is Google Image Search where you can find pictures of just about anything. But did you know that the rabbit hole goes much deeper than just typing in a word or phrase into the search box? For example, say you want to look for an image of a specific size. Simply use the drop-down box to choose 'large, extra large, medium or small image sizes. Additionally, you can refine your search using the other drop-downs to specify search terms for faces, line drawings, clip art and much more ! You can even search by colour if you so prefer!



And it doesn't stop there! If you click the 'Advanced Image Search' link a whole array of extra options spring up! Here, you can get really, really specific as to what you're looking for. Exact dimensions, specific file types - you can even look for images that match your desktop resolution!

A FEW COMPUTER TIPS

IF you don't want to use your mouse but you want to right-click something, all you have to do is press SHIFT+F10 and use your up and down arrows to highlight what you want to select, then press Enter after your selection has been highlighted.

This is great for laptop users who don't like the touchpad and don't have a mouse.

How to enlarge the size of the print on a website you're trying to use.

In Windows, press Ctrl and the plus or minus keys to change the size of the print - plus for enlarge, minus for smaller fonts.

Or you can change the entire web page or document by pressing Ctrl as you turn the wheel on top of your mouse. Turning the wheel towards you makes it smaller; turning it away makes the page larger.
