SHORT COURSES FOR 2012

Learn how to manage digital images on your computer, then use Photoscape, a freeware program, to adjust photo brightness, apply a range of filter effects, crop and resize photos and add text and frames to photos.

Excel Basics (8 x 1 hour sessions)

Excel is a powerful Microsoft Office application. This course will cover the basic features of Excel, including those required to record and monitor expenditure, create, sort and filter personal records and produce forms.

Gmail (4 x 1 hour sessions)

This course will include using Gmail to send and receive email, managing contacts, creating labels to manage Gmail messages and managing a Gmail account. A schedule and venue is still being finalised.

PHOTO SHARING

Flickr is almost certainly the best online photo management and sharing application on the Internet.

It is the best way to store, sort, search and share your photos online. Flickr helps you to organize all your photos and offers a way for you to share your photos with friends, family and the web if desired...

Why use a photo sharing service?

We assume that you have taken hundreds of photos using your new digital camera which you may have acquired over the Christmas holidays.

What to do with all those digital photos, and all those taken over the years, digital and otherwise?

It is hard to imagine anything more joyful than sitting with the ones you love and sharing pictures of the good times you have spent together. In an era where all of your loved ones might not live under the same roof, or even in the same city or state, this cherished pastime is quickly becoming a thing of the past.

That was until **photo sharing services** started bringing families together over the internet.

As with all internet and file sharing there is a degree of LEARNING and reading up before you begin to upload your pictures. Fortunately there are plenty of websites and guides to help you. You may upload your photos to any one of many providers.

Services such as Flickr, Photobucket, Shutterfly, Picasa, Webshots, SmugMug, and other photo sharing sites have a host of features that make photo sharing easy, fun, and sociable.

Uploading your photos to these sites is easy and quick and can be done in batches.

Uploading photos directly from camera phones is a handy feature. Some photo sharing services have apps that will upload a photo from your phone with one click, while others force you to send an email with a file attachment.

Flickr makes the process of uploading and sharing your pictures as painless as possible. You don't have to jump through hoops to have your photos uploaded. There are plenty of options and the choice is yours as what to do with your photos

Flickr gives you all the necessary tools to edit and manipulate your photos almost at will. It has a straightforward uploading process and several photos can be uploaded at once, which is called batch uploading. It allows you to group and display your photos to suit your convenience and preference.

It has a great HELP section and there are always the millions of Flickr users to help when needed. There is also a FAQ on the website as well as a forum which may be easily accessed.

You can also search through the millions of photos already uploaded for photo ideas. There you can share your photos almost instantaneously with as many people as you wish. You also have the option to choose who can see your photos to ensure your privacy.

There are no limits to how you share your photos anymore. With a world of possibilities at your fingertips, what you are going to do with it is up to you.

Integration with social networks is an important part of photo sharing services. Look for buttons that enable you to share photos on Twitter, Facebook, and your other favourite social sites. Flickr excels at making it easy to share your photos on a variety of social media sites.

However, too much sharing can be a dangerous thing. You should be able to set up public and private albums, and even password-protected access to albums or specific photos. An "invite" feature lets you send emails or text messages to selected contacts inviting them to view your latest photos.

COMPUTER MAINTENANCE

Disk Cleanup

As Windows goes through its daily business, it creates and stores a lot of temporary files, thumbnails and other such things that over time will take up space and slow down your computer. Clean them up with the Windows Disk Cleanup tool. You can find it by going to the Start menu and selecting **All Programs > Accessories > System Tools > Disk Cleanup**.

Another great free tool is the excellent CCleaner from Piriform.

Clean the registry

The files stored in the Windows registry also need cleaning up from time to time, so maintaining a clean and organized registry is an important part of keeping your computer running smoothly.

Take a look at [Wise Registry Cleaner](#) and your computer's registry will soon be optimized for all the work it needs to do. Take care about downloading and using Registry Cleaners. Some of them are known to be fakes or rogue software. There are plenty of free and reliable registry cleaners available. Indeed CCleaner includes a basic registry cleaner as well.

Defragment

When you defragment your hard drive you are asking Windows to reorganize the contents of the drive so that it uses less space and stores files more efficiently. This can speed up your computer and help your programs to run more smoothly. XP, Vista, and Windows 7 have built-in defragmentation tools and you can access them by going to:

Start > All Programs > Accessories > System Tools > Disk Defragmenter

SPYWARE / ANTIVIRUS SCANS

The last sure fire way of ensuring your computer is in the best shape possible is to check that you are up to date with antivirus and spyware scans.

Malware is a common problem today and something that will definitely stop your PC from operating at its peak performance. However, there are a plethora of great software solutions out there that can clean your computer quickly and efficiently

While all this might seem like a long list of tasks to complete, many of them are quick to accomplish, and others can be scheduled to run automatically in the background. Together, they are a great way to make sure that your PC is all it can be. Good luck with your maintenance!
